

About the Collection

Bloomsburg University's Department of Art and Art History maintains a diverse permanent art collection with works displayed throughout campus in many of the academic, administrative, and residence facilities. The collection represents a vital resource enriching the aesthetic and cultural climate of Bloomsburg University. Since the collection began in 1962, over 500 works have been placed on public view. Works of art in the permanent collection have been acquired from individuals, bequests, and donors, as well as grants from the National Endowment for the Arts, The Pennsylvania Council on the Arts, and The Childe Hassam Fund of The American Academy of Arts and Letters.

The University is fortunate to possess a considerable number of large scale outdoor works installed on campus. The pieces selected for The Sculpture Walk project represent a variety of mediums, techniques, styles, and themes, and includes examples of twodimensional works chosen for their particular importance and accessibility.

Parking Information

Visitors may park on campus with a **'Visitor's Parking Permit'**. Parking Permits are available at the University Police Station anytime or at Carver Hall and Buckingham Maintenance Center Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Parking is enforced Monday - Friday 6am - 5pm.
